2023 GRANTS







The Boys & Girls Club of Washington County's Shenandoah site, which received a 2023 grant from NCCF, provides Noble County youth resources they might not otherwise have while helping our communities' working families.

In partnership with the Foundation for Appalachian Ohio, the Noble County Community Foundation awarded nine grants, totaling \$15,000, in 2023.

BOYS & GIRLS CLUB OF WASHINGTON COUNTY

The Boys & Girls Club of Washington County opened a location at Noble County's Shenandoah Elementary School in 2022. This spot provides a safe space before and after school for all school-aged youth in the community and access to academic support, fun educational programming and opportunities to socialize. This grant helps cover the cost of healthy snacks the program provides daily.

CALDWELL EXEMPTED VILLAGE SCHOOL DISTRICT

Students at Caldwell Elementary School have advocated for a space where they can engage in hands-on learning and explore real-world problems. This grant is providing equipment for a new STEM-focused makerspace in the school's library, where K-8 students can engage in collaborative learning experiences and develop skills the local Business Advisory Council has identified as important to the county's businesses.

CANCER SUPPORT COMMUNITY CENTRAL OHIO

This grant supports Living with Cancer Support Groups offered at no cost to Noble County cancer patients of all ages, their caregivers and their family members. Provided in collaboration with the Noble County Health Department, these programs seek to decrease psychological stress and increase quality of life and access to information and resources for anyone impacted by a cancer diagnosis.

2023 GRANTS

LUTHERAN SOCIAL SERVICES

Every month, Lutheran Social Services holds two food pantry distributions and a produce distribution in Noble County, providing residents in need access to healthy food. This grant is funding food purchases for the distributions, assisting the increasing number of our neighbors who need a helping hand.




NOBLE COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

This grant helped replace the metal roof on Bethel Primitive Church at Heritage Park, preserving our county's history for the future. Built in 1888, this treasured piece of history is used for church services, weddings and tours that allow everyone from local youth groups to visitors at the annual Appalachian Foothills Fall Festival to experience 19th-century life in Noble County.

RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE CHARITIES OF CENTRAL OHIO

Noble County families stay an average of 41 nights each year at the Ronald McDonald House – a home away from home while caring for their children who are battling serious illness at Columbus-area hospitals. This grant is helping to cover the cost of overnight stays, providing a safe haven for local families facing difficult times.

INVESTING IN NOBLE COUNTY'S YOUNG LEADERS

In 2023, FAO partnered with its affiliate foundations to fund projects developed and implemented by local youth under age 18. The goal of this funding is to empower young leaders and inspire them to embrace greater roles in their communities.

NCCF awarded youth-led project grant funding to:

THE IBELIEVE FOUNDATION

This grant is funding the participation of five Noble County high school students in the 2024 iBELIEVE Youth Leadership Workshops at no cost to them or their families. The workshops focus on leadership skill development with the goal of equipping young people to create positive change in their schools, communities and beyond.

NOBLE COUNTY CARES

Each year, the Students Against Destructive Decisions chapters at Noble Local and Caldwell schools lead Red Ribbon Week activities in the districts' elementary and high schools and the annual Prom Pledge/Mock Crash event. This grant is supporting

the students' leadership and service to their school communities by covering costs associated with these events as well as substance use disorder awareness and prevention materials.

NOBLE LIFT YOUTH LEADERSHIP

Noble LIFT Youth Leadership's 2024 capstone project is planning and building a community garden – complete with vegetables, fruits and flowers – at the Caldwell Public Library Annex. This grant is contributing to this youth-led project that will provide fresh and healthy produce for the community, as well as educational opportunities in partnership with The Ohio State University Extension Office.

MEET OUR GROWING HOME FELLOWS

In 2023, FAO and its affiliate foundations welcomed the inaugural class of Growing Home Fellows, including 12 individuals who live and/or work in Noble County. The Growing Home Fellowship is designed to recruit, retain and nurture our region's next generation of community builders. In exchange for committing to live, work and volunteer in their communities for five years, the fellows receive a financial stipend and access to a leadership program.

COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHT

A transformational gift from OhioHealth

In May 2023, the Foundation for Appalachian Ohio announced a transformational gift from OhioHealth to support initiatives that improve quality of life in the communities served by OhioHealth Southeastern Medical Center.

OhioHealth committed \$7.25 million across three funds at FAO, including \$250,000 for NCCF's endowment. Their generosity will be reinvested in Noble County through our annual grantmaking, helping to fill our communities' greatest needs, seize our most promising opportunities and improve the well-being of all who live here.

2023 also saw Washington Electric Cooperative donate \$10,000 to NCCF's endowment and the Noble County Community Improvement


