

FAO was created to serve Appalachian Ohio as a whole while also ensuring every county had access to local philanthropic resources. We partner with communities to create local foundations that benefit from FAO's support in fundraising, training, and communications as well as through management of the fund's administration and investments. Communities can focus on what matters most—energizing the community to grow permanent, local resources for their benefit.

GRANTMAKING

In fiscal year 2016, FAO distributed more than \$1.5 million in grants and scholarships. Since its inception in 1998, FAO has invested more than \$9 million back into the community through grants and scholarships to nonprofit organizations, educational institutions, community groups, and students in Appalachian Ohio and across the globe. This support achieves meaningful, measurable results and leverages significant investments from other foundations, donors, and grants.
