Directions: Scholarships offered through the Foundation for Appalachian Ohio (FAO) are made possible by the generosity of donors who support the post-secondary efforts of the region's students. Please review the following steps to complete the application process. **Only complete applications will be considered.**

- Step 1:** Scholarships offered through FAO have specific criteria developed by donors and FAO's Scholarship Committee. Please review all criteria on the following pages to determine the appropriate scholarships for which you will apply.
- Step 2:** **Applicant Appraisals (pages 10 & 11)** – Two appraisal forms are attached. You are encouraged to select a school counselor or teacher/professor; if this is not applicable, you may select an employer, member of the clergy, job supervisor, or other person who is in a position to recommend you according to the given criteria. Detach and deliver the forms to your appraisers as soon as possible and determine how they prefer to submit the forms. **You may collect and include them with your application, or the appraisers may email/mail them separately to the Foundation (see options below).**
- Step 3:** **Transcript Information (page 9)** – Students must include a school transcript (official or unofficial) with their application.
- Step 4:** **Complete a FAFSA** (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) online and attach the EFC (Expected Family Contribution) page of the *Student Aid Report* (SAR) with this application. **Only the page with EFC (Expected Family Contribution) number is needed.** (www.fafsa.gov.)
- Step 5:** Complete Personal Statements.
- Step 6:** If any questions are not applicable, please provide an explanatory note referring to the questions by section. You are responsible for ensuring all supporting documents are submitted. **This application becomes valid only when all the following have been received by FAO:**
 - ___ Completed, signed application;
 - ___ Personal Statements;
 - ___ Current, unofficial or official Transcript of student grades/scores (student name and school name must appear on the transcript);
 - ___ Two (2) completed appraisal forms, either attached or emailed/mailed directly; and

Scholarship Application: The Foundation for Appalachian Ohio (FAO) uses a common scholarship application for all opportunities listed below. Only one application is needed, but please check the box next to all scholarships you are applying for and note how you meet criteria for each in the Personal Statements you complete. Additional scholarship opportunities are also available (with separate applications) on FAO's website www.appalachianohio.org.

Process: FAO annually appoints a Scholarship Committee to recommend awards. Final approval is made by the Foundation's Board of Trustees and decisions are final. FAO scholarship awards may vary from year to year in the number and amount of each award. All awards are made payable directly to the institution of enrollment on the recipient's behalf for the purposes and expenses associated with tuition, fees, books, supplies and equipment required (by all in the class) for coursework.

Notification of Awards: All scholarship award recipients will be officially contacted by FAO no later than May 24, 2020. The AK Steel Foundation



The **AK Steel Foundation Student Scholastic Award for Science, Technology, Math and Engineering** was established by the AK Steel Foundation to provide a permanent source of scholarship support for students pursuing studies in the STEM fields of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics, with particular

emphasis on metallurgy. Scholarships are available to both traditional and non-traditional students.

Headquartered in West Chester, Ohio (Greater Cincinnati), AK Steel produces flat-rolled carbon, stainless, and electrical steels, primarily for automotive, infrastructure and manufacturing, construction and electrical power generation and distribution markets.

AK Steel Scholarship Eligibility Requirements & Criteria

- Must be a student within the 32 counties of Appalachian Ohio pursuing or beginning pursuit of study in the **STEM fields of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics**; *priority is given to those with the specific focus of metallurgy.*
- Overall academic achievement, with a particular emphasis on high achievement and **career interest in STEM fields**, with a future commitment to work in Ohio.
- Demonstrate financial need.



The **Ora E. Anderson Scholarship** was established in honor of Ora Eaton Anderson in memory of his lifelong contributions toward the conservation and protection of Appalachian Ohio's natural environment. Throughout his life, Anderson leveraged the perspective and passion he gained as a young reporter, documenting the development of the region's forests to create educational environmental experiences for others. Through poems, essays, wood carvings, and a variety of civic contributions, Anderson led unprecedented collaborations and inspired people from all walks of life to appreciate and care for Appalachian Ohio's landscape. Over his lifetime, Ora planted tens of thousands of trees, promoted conservation education, and pursued his love of nature and the arts as an essayist, artist, and advocate.

Ora E. Anderson Scholarship Eligibility Requirements & Criteria

- Must be a graduating high school senior or possess a GED, and currently live and attend school within the 32 counties of Appalachian Ohio.
- Attend a 2-year or 4-year institution of higher education to pursue post-secondary **studies associated with the natural sciences**, including but not limited to: forest and wildlife management; environmental restoration; natural and historical interpretation; ecotourism and related-disciplines associated with broadly protecting plants, animals, and the environment.
- **Candidates who demonstrate overall commitment to environmental protection and conservation will be considered**; ethical character, extracurricular activities, volunteerism, and financial need are evaluated.
- Academic performance will be considered, but the potential for success as evidenced by an individual's commitment, interest, and desire to achieve educational goals in the field of environmental sciences and/or conservation will be carefully considered.
- Recipients must show proof of enrollment at an accredited vocational school, college, or university.

Awards: Scholarships will be awarded to one male student and one female student.



The **Lee Beckett Legacy Scholarship Fund** annually provides scholarship opportunities for graduating Nelsonville-York high school seniors pursuing post-secondary studies, to ensure youth have the opportunity to continue their academic endeavors after high school. The scholarship fund is established to honor Mrs. Lee Beckett and her work to support countless students throughout her 43 years of teaching. Beckett's first teaching position was at the then York High School, and the encouragement and support she provided students enabled them to believe in their ability to succeed. Throughout her teaching career, Mrs. Beckett went above and beyond

to support the success of her students – whether assisting with scholarship applications or helping secure part-time jobs, her mentorship enabled students to realize their goals.

Lee Beckett Legacy Scholarship Eligibility Requirements & Criteria

- Applicants must be a **graduating senior of Nelsonville-York High School**.
- Plan to pursue a post-secondary education, either full or part-time, at an accredited vocational or technical training program, community college, college, or university.
- Student applicants must have at least a 2.5 GPA on a 4.00 scale.
- A personal essay must be submitted demonstrating balance in life activity and community engagement – academic, extracurricular, employment, and volunteer service.
- Scholarship recipients must agree to participate in ten hours of community service, five hours per semester (or 2.5 per quarter), during the academic year of the scholarship award. Interim reports detailing volunteer work and their post-secondary studies must be supplied to FAO (form to be provided to recipients by FAO).

Awards: Scholarships will be awarded to one male student and one female student.

The **Bellisio Foods Scholarship** was established in honor of Bellisio foods founder, Jeno Paulucci. Bellisio Foods, one of the nation's largest and fastest growing frozen food companies, is the maker of a wide variety of frozen food brands, including Michelina's, Boston Market, Chili's at Home, Overhill Farms, Eating Well, EAT!, and Atkins. The Bellisio Foods fund awards scholarships to children and grandchildren of Bellisio Foods employees pursuing post-secondary education, including technical and trade school, community college, university, etc. Bellisio's leadership and scholarship fund encourages economic success and access to educational opportunity.



Bellisio Foods Scholarship Eligibility Requirements & Criteria

- Recipients shall be chosen on the basis of: financial need, character as evidenced by personal conduct, values, and attitudes and behaviors towards others; and community service as evidenced by leadership, service and activities; and academic performance and potential.
- **Applicants must be dependent children of a current employee** in good standing for at least one year, including biological children, legally adopted children, children placed with employees for adoption, stepchildren and any children for whom an employee is the legal guardian; grandchildren of employees, regardless of dependent status, also qualify. Employees may be at any U.S. location of Bellisio Foods. Dependents and grandchildren of senior executives are excluded.
- Candidates must be pursuing post-secondary education, full or part-time, at an accredited vocational or technical training program, community college or four-year college in the U.S.
- Candidates must have at least a 2.5 GPA on a 4.00 scale.
- Priority will be given to students receiving the Bellisio Food Scholarship award for the first time and no student may receive more than four (4) awards.
- Assistance is not intended for pursuit of advanced degrees (e.g., master's degree).

Awards: Scholarship awards are determined based on the number of applicants.

The **Jenny Cornelius-Woltz Memorial Scholarship** was established in 2006 to honor the life and memory of Jenny Cornelius-Woltz by providing scholarship awards to one or more deserving students graduating from **John Glenn High School in Guernsey County, with a primary interest in nursing**. The scholarship awards are to defray the expenses associated with attaining a post-secondary education at an accredited institution, in the field of nursing; or alternatively, within the medical professions more broadly, should no graduating seniors apply and/or qualify whose primary interest is in nursing.

Jenny Cornelius-Woltz Memorial Scholarship Eligibility Requirements & Criteria

- Those applying must be **graduating high school seniors of John Glenn High School who have been accepted to an accredited post-secondary institution offering nursing programs, or alternatively, training within the fields of medicine**.

- Priority consideration will be given to those who demonstrate financial need, ethical character, and participation in extracurricular activities; as well as potential for success as demonstrated by an individual's commitment and desire to achieve professional goals in the area of nursing or related medical fields.

The **Jeff Cox and Jane Schumacher Cox Scholarship** was established to provide post-secondary scholarships to students at Buckeye Trail High School and Monroe Central High School. Jeff Cox is a 1979 graduate of Buckeye Trail High School and a 1983 graduate of The Ohio State University. He completed his MBA in Finance from Wright State University in 1986. Jane Schumacher Cox is a 1981 graduate of Woodsfield High School and a 1985 graduate of The Ohio State University. Both Jeff and Jane have fond memories of their education and extracurricular activities at their respective schools, and through this scholarship fund hope to help others pursue their dreams of higher education.

Jeff Cox and Jane Schumacher Cox Scholarship Eligibility Requirements & Criteria

- Applicants must be **graduating high school seniors currently attending school at Buckeye Trail High School or Monroe Central High School**;
- Applicants must be pursuing post-secondary education at an accredited 2-year, 4-year or technical/vocational school or university; and
- Applicants should demonstrate outstanding character, academic excellence, involvement with extra-curricular activities, or work experience.



The **Lester and Thelma Ellwood Scholarship** was established to encourage and support access to educational opportunities by assisting worthy graduates of Guernsey County high schools in pursuit of post-secondary education. Lester and Thelma Ellwood strongly believed in the importance of education. When the Great Depression took hold of the Cambridge area, Lester needed to leave high school to help support his family, but always knew the value of education. Thelma graduated from high school and became Lester's partner in business as well as life. The couple

operated Ellwood Orchards, Ellwood Tractor Supply, The Beverage House, and Ellwood's Food Market. When Lester passed away in 1987, Thelma established a trust fund to provide money for college scholarships for Guernsey County high school students and, after her death, the Lester and Thelma Ellwood Educational Scholarship was created.

Lester and Thelma Ellwood Scholarship Eligibility Requirements & Criteria

- Applicants must be a **current or past graduate of Buckeye Trail High School, Cambridge High School, Meadowbrook High School, or any other Guernsey County high school**, pursuing post-secondary education at an accredited 2-year, 4-year or technical/vocational school or university.
- Applicants must demonstrate a strong work ethic and good ethical character.
- Community service will be assessed as evidenced by leadership, service, activities and references.
- Financial need will be considered and candidates must have at least a 2.5 GPA on a 4.00 scale.
- Assistance is not intended for pursuit of advanced degrees (e.g., master's degree).

Amount of Ellwood Scholarship Award: Scholarship awards and amounts will vary annually, depending on availability of funds. **Previous scholarship recipients are eligible to apply for continued support**, along with those already attending an institution and/or those returning to school later in life.



The **Bob Evans and Wayne F. White Legacy Scholarship** was established by family and friends of the two, including Bob's wife, Jewel Evans (she and her husband founded the original Wayne White Scholarship), to honor the legacy and commitment these two friends had to the Appalachian Ohio region. The late Wayne White was Director of the Ohio Appalachian Center for Higher Education (OACHE) and a founding board member of the Foundation for Appalachian Ohio. The late Bob Evans, a nationally-recognized restaurateur and philanthropist, served on the Ohio Board of Regents and

was instrumental in founding OACHE. Both passionate about education and champions of Appalachian Ohio, Both men were committed to ensuring finances were not a barrier to youth's ability to access post-secondary opportunities. White and Evans touched and inspired many with their enthusiasm, energy, and optimism. They worked to change the landscape of education, fighting for equal funding for rural schools and encouraging youth and adults to pursue higher education. Born and raised in Appalachian Ohio, both believed deeply in the academic ability and potential of the region's students to succeed. The scholarship serves to help all students realize they can pursue post-secondary education, regardless of financial situation.

Bob Evans and Wayne White Scholarship Eligibility Requirements & Criteria

- Those applying must be graduating high school seniors or possess a GED, and currently live and attend school within the 32 counties of Appalachian Ohio.

- Priority given to students with **significant financial need**, a demonstrated desire to succeed and overcome obstacles, displaying outstanding character and involvement in extracurricular activities.
- Academic performance is considered, but potential for success through an individual's commitment, interest, and desire to achieve educational goals will be carefully considered.



The **Jennifer Garrison Public Service Scholarship** was established to encourage and support the post-secondary efforts of students with a **passion for public service**. Jennifer Garrison has been working to improve the lives of Southeastern Ohioans for over 20 years, and previously served in Ohio's 93rd district as State Representative. Since her time in the legislature, Jennifer has continued to serve her community, and the family established the fund to foster and support the region's future public service leaders.

Jennifer Garrison Public Service Scholarship Eligibility Requirements & Criteria

- Scholarships are available to **graduating high school seniors from Monroe, Noble, and Washington counties**.
- Applicants must have held an elected position within their school's student government and communicate a continued **desire to be involved in public service**.
- Preference will be given to students with a grade point average between 2.5 and 3.5.

The **W. Donald and Marian Porter Huffman Family Scholarship** was established to support students of **Ashtabula or Harrison Counties** who are already pursuing post-secondary education at an accredited 2-year, 4-year or technical/vocational school or university.

Huffman Family Scholarship Eligibility Requirements & Criteria

- Scholarships are available to students who have graduated from secondary schools in **Ashtabula or Harrison Counties who have completed their first year of post-secondary education** (completing 45 credit hours or 30 semester hours, i.e., sophomore status; or the equivalence in technical/vocational programs;)
- Demonstrated academic achievement with at least a 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale;
- Financial need;
- Leadership potential demonstrated in extracurricular activities, community involvement or work experience;
- A strong work ethic and a commitment to ethical behavior and kindness demonstrated by good character.
- Priority consideration will be given to students pursuing certificates and/or degrees in **education, public service, or medical fields**.
- Previous scholarship recipients who demonstrate a high level of academic success and require support to continue their studies **are eligible to apply for continued support** and will be given priority consideration until their graduation.



The **Rose Elizabeth Bell MacConkey Scholarship Fund for Women Going into a Career in Business** was established in honor and memory of Rose Elizabeth Bell MacConkey. The scholarship will be **awarded to a young woman at Cambridge High School who will be pursuing post-secondary education leading to a career in business**. Rose worked hard to graduate from Cambridge High School in 1935. She was not financially able to attend college fulltime, so she took night classes at the Cambridge Business School, while working. Back then, she had been required to quit her job when she married. Rose had two children and was widowed at a young age. She returned to the work force taking a job in the office of Cambridge High School, where she stayed until she retired in the 1980s. Rose loved her job and when asked about her accomplishments, she always mentioned her children and working at the Cambridge High School. Rose always believed more women needed to be in business careers and running businesses. Her goals were always to empower women and to help those less fortunate.

MacConkey Scholarship Fund for Women Going into a Career in Business Eligibility Requirements & Criteria

- A **female student**, graduating from **Cambridge High School** and going to any university, college, community college or trade, vocational or technical school;
- **Must be taking a course of study related to a career in business**, e.g., business management, human resources, accounting, or any business-related field;
- Grade point average of 2.5 or above; and
- Financial need may be considered.

The **Loran and Shirley Stutz Scholarship Fund** was established by Loran and Shirley Stutz to provide students **residing in the East Guernsey Local School District** with support for post-secondary education. Their children attended East Guernsey schools, laying the foundation for successful lives after graduation. In gratitude, Loran and Shirley would like to help East Guernsey students in their next steps in education.

Eligibility Requirements & Criteria

- Must be a graduating senior **residing in the East Guernsey Local School District**; students attending public, private, or parochial schools as well as homeschooled students are eligible to apply as long as they reside in the East Guernsey Local School District;
- Applicants must have a 2.5 GPA or higher;
- Applicants must be pursuing post-secondary education at an accredited 2-year, 4-year, or technical/trade school or university; and
- Demonstrate a strong work ethic through outstanding character, academic excellence, involvement with extra-curricular activities, or work experience.

Davey L. and Sandra Jackson Turner Scholarship was established by Ashley and Mick Schumacher to support graduating students from **Monroe County's four Switzerland of Ohio local high schools: Beallsville, Monroe Central, River, or Swiss Hills Career Center.**

Turner Scholarship Eligibility Requirements & Criteria

- Scholarship is available to students graduating from **Beallsville, Monroe Central, River high schools, or Swiss Hills Career Center in Monroe County.**
- Applicants must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher;
- Applicants must demonstrate a commitment to academics, a record of community service and participation in extra-curricular activities
- Applicants must be pursuing post-secondary education at an accredited 2-year, 4-year institution of higher education to earn an associate or bachelor's degree.

Award: One \$500.00 scholarship will be awarded.



The **Ariana R. Ulloa Memorial Scholarship** was established by family, friends, and students in 2003 to honor the memory and life's work of Ariana R. Ulloa, so she may continue to live in the hearts of all she would have touched with her love. Ariana was born in Mexico and moved to Athens in 1986. She began working for the Hocking College Department of International Programs in 1990, eventually moving into the position of Director. She was known for her kind and encouraging nature and is affectionately remembered by many students as *Mamá Ariana*. Although she passed away in December 2002, Ariana's legacy lives on through this scholarship.

Ariana R. Ulloa Memorial Scholarship Eligibility Requirements & Criteria

- The scholarships are available to **international students and eligible non-citizens pursuing any field of study, as well as students pursuing a degree in international studies or international relations.**
- Those applying must already be accepted or enrolled full time in an accredited vocational school or 4-year college or university program; proof of enrollment is required.
- Preference will be given to those who demonstrate financial need, show academic achievement, are involved with extracurricular activities, and possess educational as well as personal life goals.
- Students must be residing or studying in one of the **32 counties of Appalachian Ohio, or in Franklin, Fairfield, or Delaware counties.**
