SCHOLARSHIP	DESCRIPTION
<b>AK Steel Foundation Scholastic Award</b>	Must be a student within the 32 counties of Appalachian Ohio pursuing or beginning pursuit of study in the field of <b>science, technology, engineering or mathematics</b> . Priority will be given to those with a specific focus of metallurgy. Overall academic achievement, with a particular emphasis on high achievement and career interest in STEM fields, with a future commitment to work in Ohio. Demonstrated financial need.
<b>Ora E. Anderson Scholarship</b>	Two or more \$2,500 scholarships will be awarded annually to students pursuing studies associated with the natural sciences. Applicant must be a graduating high school senior or possess a GED, and currently live and attend school within the 32 counties of Appalachian Ohio. Candidates who demonstrate overall <u>commitment to environmental protection and conservation will be considered</u> ; ethical character, extra-curricular activities, volunteerism and financial need will also be evaluated.
<b>Ariana R. Ulloa Memorial Scholarship</b>	Open to <u>international students, eligible non-citizens, or students enrolled in international studies</u> accepted or already enrolled full-time in a degree program at a community college, trade school, or 4-year college or university. Consideration given to financial need and academic achievement. Proof of enrollment required for acceptance of award.
<b>Bob Evans &amp; Wayne F. White Legacy Scholarship</b>	Those applying must be graduating high school seniors or possess a GED, and currently live and attend school within the 32 counties of Appalachian Ohio. Priority to those with financial need, and a demonstrated desire to succeed and overcome obstacles, as well as candidates who show outstanding character, academic excellence and extracurricular activities.

<b>Forrest Bachtel Scholarship</b>  <u><b>SEPARATE APPLICATION FORM REQUIRED</b></u>	<p>Must be a student at Meigs High School who is nominated by the administrative or teaching staff of <u>Meigs High School</u> or a member of the Meigs High School parent- teacher/booster organization. Nominators must submit an official nomination form and a synopsis describing the student's achievements and any known special circumstances to the Awards Advisory Committee. Nominees must then submit two letters of reference as well as his or her resume describing academic, athletic, and extracurricular activities.</p>
<b>Lee Beckett Legacy Scholarship</b>	<p>Applicants must be a graduating senior of <u>Nelsonville-York High School</u>. Plan to pursue post-secondary education, either full or part-time, at an accredited vocational or technical training program, community college, college or university. Student applicants must have at least a 2.5 GPA on a 4.00 scale. A personal essay demonstrating balance in life activity and community engagement – academic, extracurricular, employment and volunteer service. Scholarship recipients agree to participate in ten hours of community service, five hours per semester (or 2.5 per quarter), during the academic year of the scholarship award. Interim reports detailing volunteer work and their post-secondary studies must be supplied to FAO (form to be provided to recipients by FAO).</p>
<b>Bellisio Foods Scholarship</b>	<p>Established by Bellisio Foods to increase access to postsecondary opportunities for <u>dependent children and grandchildren of Bellisio employees</u>. Scholarships support programs providing training and certification in various trades and fields of vocational interest, associate degree programs and four year institutions of higher learning.</p>
<b>Jenny Cornelius-Woltz Memorial Scholarship</b>	<p>Applicants must be graduating seniors from <u>John Glenn High School in Guernsey County</u>, who will be attending an accredited post-secondary institution offering nursing programs, or alternatively, training within the fields of medicine.</p>
<b>Jeff Cox and Jane Schumacher Cox Scholarship</b>	<p>Applicants must be graduating high school seniors currently attending school at <u>Buckeye Trail High School or Monroe Central High School</u>; Candidates should demonstrate outstanding character, academic excellence and involvement with extra- curricular activities.</p>
<b>Lester and Thelma Ellwood Educational Scholarship</b>	<p>Applicants must be a graduate of <u>Buckeye Trail High School, Cambridge High School, Meadowbrook High School or any other Guernsey County High School</u>. Applicants must have obtained or will obtain a high school diploma and show proof of acceptance at a vocational school, college, or university. Applicants must demonstrate a strong work ethic and good ethical character as evidenced by personal conduct, values, and attitudes and behaviors toward others. An applicant's community service will be assessed as evidenced by leadership, service, activities and references. Financial need of the candidate will be considered. Candidates must have at least a 2.5 GPA on a 4.00 scale.</p>

<p><b>Myron Fishel Scholarship</b></p> <p><b><u>SEPARATE APPLICATION FORM REQUIRED</u></b></p>	<p>Scholarships are available for <u>Guernsey County</u> residents pursuing a post-secondary degree at an <u>Ohio</u> accredited institution of higher learning.</p>
<p><b>Jennifer Garrison Public Service Scholarship</b></p>	<p>Scholarships are available to graduating high school seniors from <u>Monroe, Noble and Washington counties</u>. Applicants must have held an elected position within their school's student government and communicate a continued desire to be involved in public service. Preference will be given to students with a grade point average between 2.5 and 3.5.</p>
<p><b>W. Donald and Marian Porter Huffman Heritage Scholarship</b></p>	<p>Scholarships are available to students who have graduated from secondary schools in <u>Ashtabula or Harrison Counties</u> who have <u>completed their first year of post-secondary education</u> who have financial need and leadership potential. Priority consideration given to students pursuing certificates and/or degrees in education, public service, or medical fields. Previous scholarship recipients are eligible to apply for continued support.</p>

Both the Smith Scholastic Award and Smith Community Service Award are intended to be awarded to graduating seniors planning to attend a 4-year <u>Ohio</u> college or university.</p>
