

BACHTEL SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS PROGRAM Nomination & Application Forms

Dr. Harry Keig grew up to become a successful physician and surgeon in the Omaha area but never forgot his home community of Meigs County. He also never forgot the life-shaping influence of his friend, Forrest Bachtel, long time teacher and coach at Middleport High School. When Dr. Keig passed away in 2003, his bequest created a \$500,000 endowed fund at the Foundation for Appalachian Ohio in honor of his friend Mr. Bachtel with the purpose of providing higher education scholarships to students in Meigs County to assist with expenses that few other funding sources address.

Bachtel Scholarships Awards

Bachtel Scholarships will be awarded on an annual basis to students graduating from Meigs High School. Students will be able to use the awards for a variety of higher education related expenses including, travel, books and supplies, computer equipment and student fees. While the ethical character of any candidate and extracurricular activities are considerations, financial need is not, except in cases where other factors to be considered are essentially equal. Annually, the Foundation for Appalachian Ohio will award:

- Two scholarships in recognition of athletic excellence (one male and one female student); and
- Two scholarships in recognition of academic achievement (one male and one female student).

Each scholarship will be for a total amount of \$7,500 (\$2,500 per academic year, for three academic years).

An Awards Advisory Committee will annually process applications and formulate recommendations to the Foundation for Appalachian Ohio as to who the recipients of the Bachtel Scholarship Awards will be. This committee will include: 1) a representative of the donor's family; 2) an educational leader, administrator, or parent volunteer associated with Meigs High School, who will gather opinions from faculty members familiar with nominated students; and 3) other members the Foundation for Appalachian Ohio deem appropriate.

Eligible students must be nominated by the administrative or teaching staff of Meigs High School or a member of the Meigs High School parent-teacher/booster organizations. Nominators must submit an official nomination form and a synopsis describing the student's achievements and any known special circumstances to the Awards Advisory Committee. Nominees must then submit two letters of reference as well as his or her resume describing academic, athletic, and extracurricular activities.
