SCHOLARSHIP	DESCRIPTION
AK Steel Foundation Scholastic Award	Must be a student within the 32 counties of Appalachian Ohio pursuing or beginning pursuit of study in the field of science, technology, engineering or mathematics . Priority will be given to those with a specific focus of metallurgy. Overall academic achievement, with a particular emphasis on high achievement and career interest in STEM fields, with a future commitment to work in Ohio. Demonstrated financial need.
Ora E. Anderson Scholarship	Two or more \$2,500 scholarships will be awarded annually to students pursuing studies associated with the natural sciences. Applicant must be a graduating high school senior or possess a GED, and currently live and attend school within the 32 counties of Appalachian Ohio. Candidates who demonstrate overall <u>commitment to environmental protection and conservation will be considered</u> ; ethical character, extra-curricular activities, volunteerism and financial need will also be evaluated.
Ariana R. Ulloa Memorial Scholarship	Open to <u>international students, eligible noncitizens, or students enrolled in international studies</u> accepted or already enrolled full-time in a degree program at a community college, trade school, or 4-year college or university. Consideration given to financial need and academic achievement. Proof of enrollment required for acceptance of award.
Bob Evans & Wayne F. White Legacy Scholarship	Those applying must be graduating high school seniors or possess a GED, and currently live and attend school within the 32 counties of Appalachian Ohio. Priority to those with financial need, and a demonstrated desire to succeed and overcome obstacles, as well as candidates who show outstanding character, academic excellence and extracurricular activities.

Forrest Bachtel Scholarship <u>SEPARATE APPLICATION FORM REQUIRED</u>	Must be a student at Meigs High School who is nominated by the administrative or teaching staff of <u>Meigs High School</u> or a member of the Meigs High School parent-teacher/booster organization. Nominators must submit an official nomination form and a synopsis describing the student's achievements and any known special circumstances to the Awards Advisory Committee. Nominees must then submit two letters of reference as well as his or her resume describing academic, athletic, and extracurricular activities.

Lee Beckett Legacy Scholarship	<p>Applicants must be a graduating senior of <u>Nelsonville-York High School</u>. Plan to pursue post-secondary education, either full or part-time, at an accredited vocational or technical training program, community college, college or university. Student applicants must have at least a 2.5 GPA. A personal essay demonstrating balance in life activity and community engagement – academic, extracurricular, employment and volunteer service. Scholarship recipients agree to participate in ten hours of community service, five hours per semester, during the academic year of the scholarship award. A report detailing volunteer work and their post-secondary studies must be supplied to FAO (form to be provided to recipients by FAO). (Awards will be made to one male and one female student)</p>
Bellisio Foods Scholarship	<p>Established by Bellisio Foods to increase access to postsecondary opportunities for <u>dependent children and grandchildren of Bellisio employees</u>. Scholarships support programs providing training and certification in various trades and fields of vocational interest, associate degree programs and four-year institutions of higher learning.</p>
Jenny Cornelius-Woltz Memorial Scholarship	<p>Applicants must be graduating seniors from <u>John Glenn High School in Guernsey County</u>, who will be attending an accredited post-secondary institution offering nursing programs, or alternatively, training within the fields of medicine.</p>
Jeff Cox and Jane Schumacher Cox Scholarship	<p>Applicants must be graduating high school seniors currently attending school at <u>Buckeye Trail High School or Monroe Central High School</u>; Candidates should demonstrate outstanding character, academic excellence and involvement with extra- curricular activities and pursuing post-secondary education at an accredited 2-year, 4-year or career/technical school</p>
Lester and Thelma Ellwood Educational Scholarship	<p>Applicants must be a graduate of <u>Buckeye Trail High School, Cambridge High School, Meadowbrook High School or any other Guernsey County High School</u>. Applicants must have obtained or will obtain a high school diploma and show proof of acceptance at a vocational school, college, or university. Applicants must demonstrate a strong work ethic and good ethical character as evidenced by personal conduct, values, and attitudes and behaviors toward others. An applicant's community service will be assessed as evidenced by leadership, service, activities and references. Financial need of the candidate will be considered. Candidates must have at least a 2.5 GPA.</p>
Myron Fishel Scholarship <u>SEPARATE APPLICATION FORM REQUIRED</u>	<p>Scholarships are available for <u>Guernsey County</u> residents pursuing a post-secondary degree at an <u>Ohio</u> accredited institution of higher learning.</p>
Jennifer Garrison Public Service Scholarship	<p>Scholarships are available to graduating high school seniors from <u>Monroe, Noble and Washington counties</u>. Applicants must have held an elected position within their school's student government and communicate a continued desire to be involved in public service. Preference will be given to students with a grade point average between 2.5 and 3.5.</p>
W. Donald and Marian Porter Huffman Family Scholarship	<p>Scholarships are available to students who have graduated from secondary schools in <u>Ashtabula or Harrison Counties who have completed their first year of post-secondary education</u> who have financial need and leadership potential. Priority consideration given to students pursuing certificates and/or degrees in education, public service, or medical fields. Previous scholarship recipients are eligible to apply for continued support.</p>
Rose Elizabeth Bell MacConkey Scholarship Fund for Women Going into a Career in Business	<p>Scholarship is available for a female student, graduating (or past graduate) from <u>Cambridge High School</u>, going to any university, college, community college or trade, vocational or technical school and taking a course of study related to a career in business, e.g., business management, human resources, accounting, or any business-related field.</p>

<p>Dr. Allen Smith Memorial Scholarship</p> <p><u>SEPARATE APPLICATION FORM REQUIRED</u></p>	<p>Scholarships will be awarded exclusively to graduates of <u>Jackson City High School</u> and shall be distributed to institutions of higher learning selected by scholarship recipients. Both the Smith Scholastic Award and Smith Community Service Award are intended to be awarded to graduating seniors planning to attend a 4-year <u>Ohio</u> college or university.</p>
<p>Loran and Shirley Stutz Scholarship</p>	<p>Scholarships are available to graduating seniors <u>residing and attending school in the East Guernsey Local School District</u> in pursuit of a post-secondary education. Applicants must have a 2.5 GPA or higher; be pursuing a post-secondary education at an accredited 2-year, 4-year, or technical/trade school; and demonstrate a strong work ethic through outstanding character, academic excellence, involvement with extra-curricular activities, or work experience. Two scholarships will be awarded each year. Priority consideration for one scholarship award will be given to a student attending a career/technical center and the second scholarship will be awarded to a student attending a 2-year or 4-year post-secondary institution.</p>
<p>Davey L. and Sandra Jackson Turner Memorial Scholarship</p>	<p>Scholarship will be awarded (\$500.00) to graduating student from <u>Monroe County's four Switzerland of Ohio local high schools: Beallsville, Monroe Central, River, or Swiss Hills Career Center</u>. Applicants must demonstrate a commitment to academics, a record of community service and participation in extra-curricular or work activities and have a GPA of 3.0 or higher.</p>

<p>Zelma Gray Medical School Scholarship</p>	<p>Zelma Gray Scholarships are available to <u>any resident of Guernsey County Ohio enrolled in an accredited medical school</u> located within the United States, in hopes that the applicant will return to Guernsey County upon completion of his or her education to practice medicine in Guernsey County.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Application period: February 1 – June 1</u></p>
<p>Susan K. Ipacs Nursing Legacy Endowed Scholarship</p>	<p>Scholarships will be awarded to <u>second year Hocking College student pursuing studies in the Nursing Program</u>. Recipients shall be chosen based on financial need, academic efforts, and character.</p>
<p>Scholarships provided by funds established at the Foundation for Appalachian Ohio but administered by each scholarships' Advisory Committee.</p> <p>Most have an <u>April 30 application deadline, but please check with high school Guidance Offices for applications and deadlines.</u></p>	
<p>Agnew Scholarship</p>	<p>Available for graduating seniors of Guernsey County, Ohio, high schools, including those attending Mid-East Career Center; based on scholastic ability, financial need, and the potential for civic leadership.</p>
<p>Cambridge High School Class of '57 Scholarship Fund</p>	<p>These are college scholarships for graduating <u>Cambridge High School</u> students.</p>
<p>Cambridge Singers Scholarship Fund</p>	<p>This scholarship is awarded to a declared music major who is a resident of <u>Cambridge, Ohio</u>, and is currently based on proceeds from the spring show and annual patron drive.</p>
<p>Don Coss Memorial Scholarship Fund</p>	<p>Applicants must be <u>Post 84 Cambridge American Legion Baseball Team players</u> pursuing vocational programs, associate degree programs, and programs at four- year institutions of higher learning.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Application Period: June 1 – 30</u></p>

Guernsey County Board of Developmental Disabilities	The scholarship is available to residents of Guernsey County who are <u>eligible for services of the Guernsey County Board of Development Disabilities.</u>
Janet Hursey Koehler Wade Scholarship	Provides scholarship support to a graduating senior (or past graduate) from <u>Sheridan High School</u> residing in Perry County. Applicants must be U.S. citizens; majoring in business/business technology education, vocational agriculture education, or Protestant Christian seminary; and show outstanding character, academic excellence and involvement with extra-curricular activities. <u>Application period: March 1 – 31</u>
Mary Kackley-Brill Scholarship	Provides scholarship support to a graduating senior from <u>Buckeye Trail High School</u> and residing in the general area of the former school district of Madison High School.
Madison High School Alumni Scholarship	Provides scholarship support to a graduating senior residing in the general area of the former school district of <u>Madison High School</u> .
Ralph and Lenore Martin Memorial Scholarship	Scholarships will be awarded to two graduating senior students of <u>Mt. Orab High School</u> who are balanced individuals of average to outstanding academic ability with the strongest promise of potential. One scholarship will be awarded to a qualifying (attended Mr. Orab Elementary School) graduating senior nominee; and one scholarship will be awarded to a qualifying graduating senior nominee who is a member of the Mt. Orab Church of Christ. <u>Application period: March 1 – 31</u>
Mary Knauer Cambridge High School Music Scholarship	Scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior from <u>Cambridge High School</u> preferably, who is an outstanding performer and student of music, accepted into a college or conservatory of music to pursue a career in music or music-related vocation.
Madison High School Alumni Scholarship	Provides scholarship support to a graduating senior residing in the general area of the former school district of Madison High School.
Paul Sayanek Scholarship	Provides scholarship awards to seniors graduating from <u>Guernsey County High Schools</u> .
Winnie Mae Sharpe Education Fund Scholarship	Provides scholarship support to deserving students residing in the Byesville area and graduating from <u>Meadowbrook High School</u> in Guernsey County, wishing to major in education.
Doug Steele Memorial Scholarship	Awarded to a graduating senior at <u>Cambridge High School</u> who plans to pursue a bachelor's degree, with preference to those planning to major in a business specialty.
Southern Perry County Academic Scholarships	The Southern Perry County Academic Endowment Fund (SPCAEF) was established in 1987 with the purpose of creating resources to promote learning experiences for the residents of the Southern Local School District.
