READ CAREFULLY

TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THIS SCHOLARSHIP, THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS MUST BE MET:

- 1. Graduating Miller HS Seniors or Miller Alumni with No College Experience:
 - Applicant must be a graduating senior with Miller High School or a graduate of Miller High School.
 - Applicants must have or have had a 3.0 high school cumulative average. Mustbe enrolled as a full-time student (full time is defined as enrollment in 12 credithours or more).
 - Applicant must have been enrolled in M.H.S. prior to the first day of November of their 11th grade year and they must maintain continuous enrollment at M.H.S.until graduated.
 - Applicant with no college experience must be attending a 2 or 4-year college.
- 2. <u>College Undergraduates who have Previously Applied</u>:
 - Applicants who are currently an undergraduate student in college must have a 2.7 cumulative average.
 - Recipients are eligible for possible renewals.
 - Renewal Recipients must reapply using the application form and guidelines as **renewal** applicant.
- 3. <u>Graduate Students</u>:
 - Applicants who are currently a graduate student in college must have a 3.0 cumulative average.
 - Recipients are eligible for possible renewals.
 - Renewal Recipients must reapply using the application form and guidelines as a **renewal** applicant. (Please go to Section 5 for further graduate student instructions.)
- 4. <u>Trade or Adult Vocational School</u>:
 - Graduating Senior Applicants attending a trade or adult vocational school must have a minimum of a 2.8 cumulative high school accumulative average.
 - Program <u>must be less than 2 years</u> and eligible for Title IV Funding (Federal Financial Aid).
 - Applicants in this category can only apply for this scholarship <u>one</u> time.
 - Applicants must provide proof of acceptance in a program that is recognized and certified within the industry.
- 5. These funds are limited to applicants who are or will be attending a two-year or four-year college or university, graduate school, or an accredited trade school or adult vocational program.

READ CAREFULLY INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE APPLICATION

- 1. The postmark deadline for the application is **APRIL 1, 2024.**
- Answers on the application are to be printed clearly or typed. All scholarships are paid directly to the college you listed on your application.

All forms and other requested information must accompany this application when it is mailed. <u>The</u> applicant's failure to provide the requested materials and documents will causethe application to be rejected.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION: PLEASE CHECK OFF FOR YOUR COMPLIANCE

- 1. Two (2) character reference letters. Present college students may not use former high school teachers. At least one reference letter for present college students must be from a current college/university official.
- 2. <u>Official</u>, most recently completed, **transcript** of courses showing accumulated grade point average at the time of application, which reflects all courses taken during the applicant's college enrollment and/or high school applicants must supply an official transcript. The definition of an official transcript is defined as one that has the signature of the high school Counselor and seal of the school, or for a college or university, the signature of the Registrar, and seal of the school. Electronic transcripts from an official college transcript source are acceptable. Photocopies or copies will not be accepted.
- 3. All applicants must supply a biographical statement, which includes <u>educational</u> <u>background</u>, <u>extra-curricular background</u>, <u>goals</u>, <u>financial need</u>, <u>and pertinent</u> <u>information</u>. **Returning applicants should include updated educational experiences**. All information will be kept confidential.
- 4. 1st time applicants must include letter of acceptance from the college or university, trade school/adult education program which the applicant will be attending. If the applicant is already enrolled in college, this letter is not necessary. <u>APPLICANT MUST BE ENROLLED AS A FULL-TIME STUDENT</u>. Full-time is defined as enrollment in 12 semester hours. For trade and adult education programs it is a minimum of a 600- hour program.
- 5. All applicants must include a copy of their SAI page from most recent FAFSA see last page page of application for more information.
- 6. All applicants must provide a screenshot or printed copy of the Cost of Attendance from their college's website.


All documents can be submitted electronically to scholarships@ffao.org

A personal interview may be required.

If a misuse of scholarship and/or grant funds is discovered or suspected, the applicant will be requested to meet with Distribution/Selection Committee. The committee will report its findings and make recommendations to the Governing Board. The Board will make a final decision on continuance, withdrawal or repayment of the awarded funds.

All scholarships are announced at graduation. Formal letters will then be mailed to students directly with information needed to complete the scholarship award. All recipients will also be listed by name on the SPCAEF webpage at **www.AppalachianOhio.org/southernperry** the week following graduation.

Decline letters will be mailed to those students who are not receiving an award with information regarding their application as well as information on how to reapply the following year, if applicable.

- 3. Click on 'View all Activity'
- 4. Click 2024-25 FAFSA Form
- 5. Take a screen shot of the Status Tracker Box as seen below. You can attach it if you are sending your application electronically OR you can download the screenshot to your computer and print it. Include this page with your application when you mail it in.
