
## **2024 JENCO AWARDS**

### Nomination Form



The Jenco Foundation Fund at the Foundation for Appalachian Ohio celebrates people who, like Father Lawrence Martin Jenco, have made a difference in their communities through community service and visionary leadership, including through activism. It recognizes the difference everyday people can make when they give of their time, talent, and passion to help their neighbors. Established to continue the work of the Jenco Foundation, the Fund offers individual achievement awards to recognize visionary leaders and volunteers who by direct, person-to-person action have worked to increase the dignity and sense of worth of individuals in Appalachian Ohio through creative problem-solving. The award is open to people of all ages serving their communities.

This year, the Jenco Foundation Fund intends to make one or more cash awards to individuals in Appalachian Ohio who have performed noteworthy community service outside of their everyday work and/or job responsibilities. **Nominations should be for service performed beyond paid positions.** The Jenco Foundation Fund Committee believes this recognition is important to regional community development efforts and continues to encourage those who give of themselves and inspire others to volunteer in their communities.

Jenco Awardees serve their communities across many different areas, including **arts and culture**, **community and economic development**, **education**, **environmental stewardship**, **and health and human services**. What they all have in common is that their commitment to the individuals of Appalachian Ohio is not a job. It is a passion.

## **NOMINATIONS**

The nomination process is simple. Multiple nominations are welcome from the same nominator, as are multiple nominations for the same nominee. No self-nominations will be considered.

- **Step 1:** Complete the **nomination form** on the following page.
- Step 2: Write a detailed **nomination letter** to the Jenco Foundation Fund Committee explaining why you believe your nominee should be considered for a Jenco Award.
- Step 3: Compile supporting materials you believe will be helpful to the Committee in considering your nominee. Additional letters of support are highly encouraged to provide a holistic overview of the nominee and their service. Additional materials might include anecdotes from others who benefited from your nominee's work, press clippings, photos, or videos, among other possibilities.
- Step 4: Please submit your nomination packet via mail or email. To be considered by the Committee, your nomination form and letter must be postmarked by June 3, 2024, or emailed by June 3, 2024, at 11:59PM EDT. Please mail or email the completed nomination packet to:

### **AWARDS**

**Process:** All complete nominations will be considered by the Jenco Foundation Fund Committee, appointed by the Foundation for Appalachian Ohio (FAO). The Jenco Awards are Individual Achievement Awards and the FAO Board of Trustees will give final approval. The awards will be made directly to the recipients and will have no restrictions on the use of funds and will require no report. **Please note that the award is for individuals, and as such, organizations are not eligible for the award. Organizations are, however, very welcome to make nominations.** 

**Notification of Awards:** All Jenco Award recipients and their nominators will be officially contacted no later than July 31, 2024. All nominators will be contacted no later than August 15, 2024.
